Sir Fred Schonell Drive and Coldridge Street black spot project - St Lucia

START OF CONSTRUCTION

WHAT WORKS ARE COMING UP?

Brisbane City Council is upgrading the Sir Fred Schonell Drive and Coldridge Street intersection in St Lucia to improve safety for all road users. This project will be delivered under the Australian Government's 2020-2021 Black Spot Program.

WHY IS THIS WORK HAPPENING?

The Sir Fred Schonell Drive and Coldridge Street intersection has been the site of multiple serious crashes since 2014. As part of the Australian Government's Black Spot Program and National Road Safety Strategy 2011-2020, this project will improve safety at the intersection for all road users.

WHAT DOES THIS WORK INCLUDE?

The project involves upgrading the existing right turn from Sir Fred Schonell Drive into Coldridge Street from a filtered right-turn to a controlled rightturn with a dedicated right-turn lane.

To accommodate the new right-turn lane, the intersection will be reconfigured with the westbound through lane on Sir Fred Schonell Drive reduced from two lanes to one. The northbound turning lanes on Coldridge Street will change from two right-turn lanes, to one lane, improving bus movements.

To upgrade the intersection, three informal, offpeak on-street carparks on the western side of Sir Fred Schonell Drive between Coldridge and Warren Street will be permanently removed. For further information, refer to the plan overleaf.

WHERE WILL THE WORKS BE?

These works will take place within, and close by to, the intersection of Sir Fred Schonell Drive and Coldridge Street at St Lucia.

A van to store equipment and materials will be located in the northern corner of William Dart Park, next to Munro Street and Coldridge Street.

WHEN WILL THIS WORK TAKE PLACE?

Start	Late November 2021
Finish	Early 2022
Time/day	7pm - 5am, Sunday to Thursday

Works are being undertaken at night when traffic volumes are lowest, to ensure the safety of motorists and workers and to minimise traffic disruptions and impact to the local community.

At times, some construction works will also be required to take place during the day between **7am and 5pm**, **Monday to Saturday.**

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR ME?

If you live near the intersection, you may at times experience increased noise, truck movements, vibration, dust, and light.

Whilst travelling through the work site you may experience changed traffic conditions including, minor traffic delays, reduced speed limits, lane closures and detours.

Throughout construction, you will receive advanced notification of any particularly noisy or impactful out-of-hours works, or major service disruptions.


